## **JANUARY CHALLENGE**

"Make a Silk Purse Out of a Sow's Ear III"

Take an old painting and change it to make it good enough to put in an exhibit.

- 1. You can make the changes directly on the old painting, reworking the failed parts, but use solid colors only, no shading or blending.
- 2. You can make the changes on a brand new painting.
- 3. Cut up an old painting and use pieces to make a brand new painting.
- 4. Abstract it. Collage it only 20%, or multi-media it.

Check out Tricia's list of 18 ways to convert a failed effort into a masterpiece!!! Check out David Hockney's landscapes on Pinterest (Garroway Hill. Malibu, etc.)

A 4x6 photo of the original old painting must be propped up against the new one; and if the new one is different enough and has followed the rules of this challenge, the Challenge Committee will OK it to be put in a future SWS Exhibit and the 2 year and all Exhibit rules will apply.

#### **RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES:**

Entries will not be accepted unless they meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS

- 1. Do not sign your painting.
- 2. Entries must fit the theme.
- 3. Entries must be matted (they do not need to be framed).
- 4. Entries may only be submitted into one Challenge. You may not enter a challenge painting into a second Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
- 5. Entries must be new, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
- Entries cannot have been shown in an exhibit prior to the Challenge.



About the Artist: Stan Miller was born on a small farm in SE South Dakota. He was one of 7 children. Stan moved to Spokane, WA when he was 15 years old and graduated from Spokane Falls Community College with an Applied Arts Degree and a Commercial Art Degree. He remembers getting a "C" in his first watercolor class so took the class again and received an "A". This is when he fell in love with watercolor. He has been teaching since 1976 and loves it almost as much as painting. His awards are numerous such as ones from The American Watercolor Society International Exhibition (NYC), Quindao International Watercolor Exhibition (China), Artist Magazine National Competition, and Grand Prize from Watercolor Magic National Competition.

About the workshop: In Stan's workshop, he will be guiding the students through both, portrait and landscape subjects. Handouts of both portrait and landscape will be provided each day. Students may choose to do just a portrait or landscape following along with Stan. Students are also welcome to work from their own photos if they want. Stan will visit with each student throughout the workshop. Technique, color, design, and composition will be discussed and demonstrated. Choosing paintable subjects will be addressed as well. Thanks go also to Eagle Framing, for framing all four of the paintings donated by our guest artists at cost. And thanks go to all the people who oversaw the Silent Auction & Raffle during Museum hours for two weeks: Joan Garrett, Linda James, Shawna Murph (a volunteer from JustServe), Sandie Caulfield, Cheryl Keaveney, Mary Ann Quaglieri, Wendy Marshall, Vicki Curwen, Kathy Martin, Laurel Sweigart, Kay Tietz, and Jane Chapman. We sold \$685 in raffle tickets and made \$470 on the Silent Auction, for a total of \$1155. If we deduct the cost of framing the paintings (\$385), we still reaped \$770!

3. The Art Angels Holiday Workshop was held at the May Museum on Saturday, December 15th. We had 51 children participating. Many thanks to our wonderful instructors: Caren Bechtold, Alicia Cobb, Gail Kramer, Marilyn Kuenzli-Howell, Mary Ann Quaglieri, Linda James, and Ronnie Rector; and thanks to our great helpers: Jane Chapman, George Baba, Shari-Lynn Campbell, Nancy Le Sage, Bess Inouye, Brooke Cobb, Susan Tissier, and Sharon Burke, who helped the children get into the holiday spirit and create some great art! We had an added feature this time: Valerie Cohen's neighbor donated some unused art supplies, which Linda James put into two baskets and which we raffled off at the workshop; the children were thrilled, and we made \$76! We will look to do similar raffles of art supplies in the future. We also got \$32 in tips!

The Spring Workshop is usually held at the May Museum the weekend before Mother's Day, but the Museum is booked that weekend, so we are looking to find a different venue or to move the workshop to June 9, the Sunday before Father's Day (when May Museum is available). The Discovery Museum is an option, but there is a significant rental fee. So I would appreciate your ideas. The Artown "Discover Watercolor" Workshops will be held at May Museum on Friday, July 26.

#### **PUBLICITY**

We purchased radio ads on KUNR Public Radio and KTHX ("The X") to publicize the Winter "Art de Triomphe" exhibit, our brunch, and the Art Angels Silent Auction & Raffle. I also had a table at the First Thursdays at Nevada Museum of Art, promoting those events. I believe those activities, plus the longer time for the Silent Auction/Raffle, contributed to the increased number of raffle tickets sold this year. In addition, there were notices in several online calendars, to which I will be sending information about our January meeting & Lady Jill Mueller's demo. And I continue to get to the Reno Arts Consortium meetings at McKinley Arts & Culture Center, from 9-10:30 a.m. the third Thursday of each month (to which everyone is welcome), as often as possible; it's a great place to network and get out the word about what SWS is doing!
