MARCH CHALLENGE

“See-Through”

See through an open door, a window (looking in or out), an archway, through a nature-made arch as in a national park, an arch made of trees, through a gate, an alley or a street, through a hole in the wall, a keyhole, under a bridge, through a tunnel, or some type of open structure.

REMINDER: You cannot put a Workshop painting in an exhibit, but YOU CAN PUT A CHALLENGE PAINTING IN AN EXHIBIT! All the usual framing and exhibit rules apply.

RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES:

Entries will not be accepted unless they meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS

1. Do not sign your painting.
2. Entries must fit the theme.
3. Entries must be matted (they do not need to be framed).
4. Entries may only be submitted into one Challenge. You may not enter a challenge painting into a second Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
5. Entries must be new, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
6. Entries cannot have been shown in an exhibit prior to the Challenge.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, RONNIE RECTOR

March 2019

Way back when I was your Newsletter editor, I'd run little items highlighting a section from our Bylaws or Standing Rules. I highly recommend reading these two very short documents. They're on our website, but I will be happy to email or snail mail a copy to you if you wish.

The Bylaws describe our goals, when we hold meetings, and what the Board consists of and what we do. And they haven't been updated since 2004.

The Standing Rules are extremely important for our members to understand, especially when entering our exhibits. They go into detail about frames and framing, originality requirements, what types of art we accept (no alcohol ink, oil or acrylic paintings), the 80/20 rule, etc. You don't want to be sent home, painting in hand, because you didn't frame it properly! That was my first experience with an SWS entry day, and did I feel bad. I recovered, reframed the painting in the back of my 4-Runner, entered it, won a ribbon, and sold it. Happy ending! Then I went home and read the Standing Rules.

Last revised in 2015, the Standing Rules are in the process of being updated, to bring them current with our recent move to online registration for pretty much everything, where you'll find the Exhibit Guidelines (aka the prospectus) for each show, and what's happening in our Library - like how to review or request a book.

And speaking of online registration for pretty much everything, please never hesitate to reach out to anyone on your Board if you don't have access to a computer and need assistance. That's why we're here - to make sure you can easily participate in everything we do. Call me if you need help - my cell phone # is 775-772-2210. I do not turn it on while at work, but I will happily call you back when I get a break.

I hope you are working on a "See Through" piece for the March Challenge. I have several ideas rattling around in my head, but nothing I really want to paint. Like Challenge Chair Judy Berland, I'm waiting for a sign. I hope it arrives soon.

May your furnace be working, the tea kettle at the ready, and the cat in his bed where he belongs so you can just paint!

New Website Documents Pre 1900 Watercolors

Before the invention of the camera, people used watercolours to document the world. Over the centuries, painters – both professional and amateur – created hundreds of thousands of images recording life as they witnessed it. Every one of these paintings has a story to tell, but many are hidden away in archives, albums and store rooms, too fragile to display. The Watercolour World exists to bring them back into view.

We are creating a free online database of documentary watercolours painted before 1900. For the first time, you can explore these fascinating visual records on a world map, search for topics that are important to you, and compare watercolours from multiple collections in one place.

Watercolours are fragile documents: they fade over time if exposed to daylight and are vulnerable to changes in temperature and humidity. For this reason, they are often kept hidden from view, safely stored away in albums or archive boxes. As a result, they don't get the public attention they might deserve. Watercolours can easily fall into obscurity. Overlooked and undervalued, they become

neglected, and are sometimes even lost or destroyed. The Watercolour World aims to change this. By digitising watercolours, we are helping to preserve them for future generations to enjoy, creating durable digital images which can be appreciated and studied with no risk to the original artwork. And by publishing images online, we are making watercolours freely and easily accessible to everyone, enabling a global public to see – often for the first time – these important documents of the past.

Today, these works are precious and unwitting documents of a world altered by the ravages of climate change, overhunting, urbanization and other human activity. The Watercolour World, financed by the London-based Marandi Foundation, is a free online database of watercolours painted before 1900.
